Again Wheelchair Sports NSW over the summer successfully conducted our 2 major international wheelchair events namely the 2010 Summer Down Under Series of Road and Track Racing and the 2010 Sydney International Wheelchair Tennis Open.

Congratulations to the two lots of Organising Committees who worked hard to ensure the success of the events. Particular commendations to Serena Ovens Event Manager for the Summer Down Under and David Rose Tournament Director for the Tennis, who both worked in a diligent and professional manner on the events. At the same time both events budgets were break even, so there was no cost to Wheelchair Sports NSW. That with expenditures for the two events totalling \$375,000 means there was prudent financial management.

One highlight to do with the events was the Premiers Reception at Government House for athletes competing in the Summer Down Under Series. Premier Kristina Keneally proved a gracious host and it turned out to be a marvellous reception appreciated by the athletes, sponsors, board and staff of WS NSW, and other guests.

Recently I attended the 2009 NSW Annual Sports Awards and was delighted that our own Yvonne Talbott was awarded the Volunteer of the Year. This was in recognition of her outstanding service in 2009 particularly in relation to the Australian Paralympic Youth Games in Melbourne where she managed our NSW Team. Yet we all know that Mrs T. has given almost 3 decades of service to our organisation so the build up to 2009 has been enormous. Well done to athletes Kurt Fearnley and Ryley Batt who also received awards on the night.

Congratulations to our CEO Jim O'Brien who has been selected by the NSW Minister for Sport Kevin Greene to Chair the inaugural Ministerial Advisory Committee on Sport and Recreation for People with a Disability. This is wonderful recognition for Jim and in turn Wheelchair Sports NSW. Jim is joined on this committee by a couple of our good friends in Lorraine Landon (Basketball Australia) and Tanya Cox (Chair – Australian Athletes with a Disability).

Lastly I joined a number of our corporate supporters at our very recent fundraiser Race Day at Royal Randwick. A very pleasant day was had by all and whilst the day is not a big money spinner for us, it generates a tremendous amount of goodwill amongst our supporters, sponsors and friends of Wheelchair Sports NSW. Congratulations to our staff who put in many hours to organise the day.

A reminder to all our members that we are now accepting membership in line with our financial year i.e. April 1st 2010 to March 31st 2011. At the same time Wheelchair Sports NSW Grant applications close on March 31st. No late applications will be accepted for these Grants.

Just on our Grants, the monetary levels of our grants have been reduced for this year. This is to do with the current financial situation of our organisation.

Wheelchair Sports NSW as a small charity has suffered in the economic down turn of the past 18 months. Whilst we will have to cut back to some degree on the service and support (e.g. Grants) we offer to members, we will attempt to minimise this effect. At the same time we are looking to cut some of our overheads.

There are some staff changes at Wheelchair Sports. David Rose leaves us after 4 years service and we thank David for his contributions in this time. Lottie Adcock leaves from the reception / admin position. Sports Development Officer Jennifer Scattene takes on our biggest sports portfolio – wheelchair basketball.

Whilst on wheelchair basketball I must apologise to our basketballers at the development level, as we have struggled to organise an Autumn League as in previous years. Such is the packed nature of the wheelchair basketball calendar in the first 6 months of this year, it has been impossible to organise a League over a block period of time. World Championships for Men and Women in Birmingham (UK) in June have meant a trickle down effect to our development programs.

I am pleased to report that Wheelchair Sports NSW was awarded the 2011 Junior National Games for Athletes with a Disability. We bided for the Games with Victoria who conducted the 2009 event. The Games in 2009 were sponsored by the Australian Paralympic Committee and it is hoped that the APC will join forces with us in 2011 when the Games will be conducted in the 2011 September / October school holidays.

We have also placed a bid for the 2011 Oceania Paralympic Qualifying Championships for wheelchair rugby. We successfully conducted this same event in 2007. This time we are up against Beijing and Seoul for this bid. If we get these Championships (we will know by May this year) it could be a very busy time for WS NSW in the latter part of 2011.

Recently I attended the finals day of the Women's Festival of Wheelchair Basketball at Narrabeen. Days like this one make working at Wheelchair Sports NSW a joy. The bond between the 30 women who played in the event was obvious and they all displayed wonderful spirit, friendship and goodwill. Congratulations to all those involved.

## 2010 SUMMER DOWN UNDER TRACK AND ROAD RACING SERIES

Defending champion and Australian Paralympian Kurt Fearnley made it 6 consecutive wins by triumphing in the 2010 Oz Day 10K Road Race. The pinnacle event in the Summer Down Under Wheelchair Road and Track Racing Series, the Oz Day 10K attracted a Paralympic quality field where the Women's race went right down to the tape.

The Series began in Canberra where many of the world's elite Paralympic track and road racers arrived on January 18 2010 to compete in the first major international competition on the 2010 wheelchair racing calendar.

Series host Wheelchair Sports NSW staged a training camp and an international standard track meet in Canberra followed by another track meet and the Oz Day 10K in Sydney.

A strong Australian contingent was headed by Kurt Fearnley (T54/Open Men). He was faced with an elite international field including Swiss racer Marcel Hug, UK's David Weir, USA's Joshua George (T53/Open Men), and Canadian Joshua Cassidy

The Australian women featured in the Series on the track and the road and they were led by NSW athlete Christie Dawes (the 2009 Oz Day 10K defending Champion). Her main competition was from Switzerland's Edith Hunkeler, USA threat Amanda McGrory and UK's Shelly Woods.

Athletes representing Japan, Canada, Great Britain, New Zealand, New Caledonia, Spain, Switzerland, Sweden, USA and of course Australia entered the Series.

### Highlights of the Series included:

- The return to a full Series with competition in Canberra and Sydney.
- A larger entry field than previous years with teams from Canada, Sweden and Switzerland.
- Australia's Kurt Fearnley (T54/Open Men) continued to thrill spectators with his 6th consecutive title in the Oz Day 10K, as well as victories on the track in Canberra in the 10,000m, and in Sydney in the 1500m.
- In the women's competition Switzerland's Edith Hunkeler (T54/Open Women) claimed victory in a strongly fought Oz Day 10K.
- Junior Matthew Lack (NZ) recorded 2 new world junior records at the Sydney Track Meet (800m and 1500m) and won his 3rd consecutive Oz Day 10K Junior race.
- A Come 'n Try track mentor clinic (in combination with an APC Toyota Paralympic Talent Search) was conducted during the Series in Sydney. Juniors from NSW, rehab clients from Sydney, and Australian juniors from the Series were mentored by elite athletes and coaches.

WS NSW recognises the support of our sponsors namely the NSW Department of Sport and Recreation, Star City Hotel and Apartments, the Australian Paralympic Committee, Sydney Harbour Foreshore Authority, Australian Athletes With a Disability (AAWD), Contact and Clarendon, Active Sportz and Biz Express.

The success of this year's event is in no small part due to the services of Serena Ovens who took on the role of Event Manager. The athletes truly appreciated Serena's input to the Series and we thank her for all her efforts.

However the playing schedule was completed with some creative rescheduling and early starts / late finishes to combat the unruly weather.

**The Festival of Women’s Wheelchair Basketball 2010**

The Festival of Women’s Wheelchair Basketball was held at the Sydney Academy of Sport last weekend and proved to be a huge success. Players came from Queensland, Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia, ACT and across NSW to be part of the annual festival which is the only development-level competition for women in Australia.

There were a total of 30 players whose experience ranged from brand new, right through to Paralympic level, including able bodied women who just love the sport and want to be part of it.

The festival was also an opportunity for developing coaches and referees to extend their knowledge of the game and build their skills.

One of the highlights of the competition was newcomer, Sarah Walsh (NSW). 12 year old Sarah is competitive in a number of sports already and her talents stood out on the court. Her father, Tom, also joined the festival for the first time coaching the Rockets.

In Sunday’s final, Paralympians Tina McKenzie, Alison Mosley and Katie Hill supported their respective teammates well, but the combination of McKenzie and Mosely proved too strong for the opposition and their team won the festival with the final score 49-41.

A very big thank you to all the players who travelled from around the country at their own expense to participate and also to everyone who contributed to the event including coaches, referees, volunteers and officials.

**Handcycling**

Handcycling in NSW is experiencing a boom in participation and competition. Over 19-20 March, the National Handcycling Series made its way to Waratah Park in Sutherland (19 March) and Lansdowne Park (20 March) for Race 3 in the Series. Athletes from across Australia will continue to fight it out on the tough courses for the right for the yellow leader’s jersey.

Domestically, the NSW Handcycling Series will continue on 20 June at Dunc Gray Velodrome with 4 races making up the Series. Each race will comprise a sprint lap followed by a 20 minute + 3 lap criterium race for each classification. All ages and levels are encouraged to participate.
