Congratulations to our marvellous 24 paralympians who competed so wonderfully well at the London Paralympic Games. Our WS NSW athletes came away with a haul of 5 Gold, 12 Silver and 11 Bronze Medals. I would have thought a very commendable performance by our members.

We all were thrilled with the coverage of the London Paralympics by ABC TV. The broad, well researched, enthusiastic and professional coverage was appreciated by all of us back home in Australia, and our paralympians on returning home from London were quite amazed to hear of the interest that had been generated during the Games.

We were fortunate to have two of the ABC paralympic commentators support us at our functions in the last little while. Stephanie Brantz was MC at our corporate fundraising luncheon in the city and she did a sterling job. The effervescent and dynamic Amanda Shalala was MC at our WS NSW Annual Awards at Bankstown Sports Club. Both these ABC commentators were right at home interviewing a number of our paralympians at these functions.

I was privileged to attend the Paralympian of the Year Dinner with 700 others and it was great that 2 of our athletes shared in the Team of the Year award namely Ryley Batt as a member of the Gold Medal winning Wheelchair Rugby Team, and Liesl Tesch as a member of the Gold Medal winning 2 person keelboat crew. Liesl you have finally achieved that elusive Gold Medal!

Ryley Batt incidentally was a finalist in the NSW Young Australian of the Year. In between all these awards Ryley had lunch with Prince Charles and Camilla, Duchess of Cornwall, in Canberra. What a packed schedule for Ryley.

Back in September a Testimonial Dinner was held for our former President and Chairman - Michael Godfrey-Roberts. The 60 (maximum for the room) who attended celebrated Michael's achievements and contributions over 32 years with Wheelchair Sports NSW. Speakers included Life Member Graeme Watts, Patron Louise Sauvage OAM, CEO Jim O'Brien and myself. An emotional and moving response by Michael followed these speakers. A highlight of the night was the wonderful photos of Michael over the years and some of these were framed in a collage as a gift to Michael. A fitting tribute night for Michael who has given so much to our organisation.

On a sad note one of the 2 Foundation Members of Wheelchair Sports NSW passed away in August. Trevor French was one of those original trailblazers who attended the first meeting of Wheelchair Sports NSW (then the Paraplegic Sports Club of NSW) in October 1961. Trevor along with Daphne Hilton (nee Ceeney) were given Foundation membership at Government House at the start of our 50 Year celebrations in January 2011.

Life Member Richard Cordukes and CEO Jim O'Brien attended Trevor's funeral in Springwood where a guard of honour of Morris Minor vintage cars farewelled Trevor. Trevor was a member of Mini Car Club of NSW for 35 years and he was also a Paralympian at the Tokyo Games in 1964. Vale Trevor.

Ryley was outstanding at the Paralympics being one of the superstars of the Games. 160 goals in 5 games meant he was unstoppable on the rugby court. Sincere congratulations on the Gold medal to Ryley Batt.

Col Dennis won our prestigious Club person of the Year. Col was on the Board of WS NSW for 4 years before retiring this year. However his contribution continues. He is always quick to volunteer and this year he has spent a considerable amount of time in our offices calling our donors and supporters thanking them, asking for contributions or trying to increase the numbers at our fundraising events. Col is on a Kevin Betts Stadium committee and also assists in the area of HR with appointment of staff and staff performance reviews. A willing and diligent worker is Col Dennis.

The Nick Morozoff Scholarship

This is the second year of the scholarship.

Nick Morozoff passed away in April 2011 leaving Wheelchair Sports as one of its most loved and respected members. Nick joined Wheelchair Sports NSW 30 years ago and in this time he was a marvellous mentor and “life coach” for many of our members, particularly those who went through spinal rehabilitation. Nick was made a Legend of Wheelchair Sports in 2009.

Nick’s contribution will continue to be recognised and honoured through the awarding of this Scholarship. Nick’s widow Allison Wright was in attendance to present the trophy.

The Scholarship is for someone who has only recently been through spinal rehab, the sort of person Nick would have mentored and encouraged. As well this person must be showing a strong involvement in and commitment to wheelchair sport. The scholarship is a monetary one with the money going into the winner’s Levy account. We sincerely thank Rob King OAM the benefactor of this scholarship.

The **2012 Nick Morozoff Scholarship** recipient was **Mitchell Stone**.

At the age of 22, Mitchell Stone became a paraplegic after being involved in a boating accident in late 2010. After completing his rehabilitation at Royal Rehab in Ryde, Mitchell became heavily involved in wheelchair basketball in 2011. He is now a regular at both the Sutherland Wheelie Sharks Thursday night wheelchair

basketball development sessions and also the Wednesday night Daceyville scrimmage sessions. Mitchell was also selected to be part of Wheelchair Sports NSW wheelchair basketball Talented Athlete Program (TAP), which means he is provided with tailored, one on one coaching sessions with the TAP coach.

Mitchell has also joined the team of Wheelchair Sports NSW Roadshow presenters and all reports from senior Roadshow presenters indicate that Mitchell is doing an excellent job in the presentation of the Roadshow to schools and community centres. Congratulations Mitchell.

The Clubperson of the year was awarded to Col Dennis. Col Dennis joined us in 2007 when he chaired the organising committee for the highly successful 2007 Oceania Wheelchair Rugby Championships. These were recognised as the best Oceania Rugby Championships ever.

Wheelchair Sports NSW Roadshow

supported by Transport for NSW

It has been a great last few months of 2012 with October and November fully booked for Roadshow programs at schools and community centres.

During this time we have visited 66 schools, PCYC's and Vacation Care groups. We have also had the privilege of participating in 3 Community Events which included - Kites for Kids, Sutho Cops & Rodders Safety and Car Show, and Camp Lionheart - Kids Rehab at The Childrens Hospital at Westmead. We have also visited two regional areas namely, Inverell and Blayney. Overall 5,697 students have experienced our unique and educational program during the past few months.

As mentioned previously Transport for NSW has come on board as the major sponsor of the Roadshow Program for the next two years. We have been adding Transport for NSW logos to our documentation, we will be getting both of the Roadshow Vans re-branded with logos and messages, and eventually new uniforms for all Roadshow staff.

It has been quite a few years since I last watched a Roadshow, but last week I personally got to experience another Roadshow Presentation at a school in my local area. I was so impressed by the professionalism of our staff and the amazing environment they create with the students participating in the wheelchair basketball game. During the presentation the students were captivated by our presenters personal stories which created many, many questions from all those participating. The wheelchair basketball game that followed had all of the students screaming out in support of their fellow class mates, creating an electric feeling in the school gym. We even got all of the teachers involved in a final game which was great for the kids to see!

Again, I would like to thank all of the Roadshow Presenters who do such an amazing job presenting to these students and getting across the important messages of the consequences of taking risks, living with a disability and the role of sport for those with a disability.

I am currently posting out Information Sheets on the Roadshow Program to all schools in NSW for re-bookings or new bookings for 2013.

If you or anyone in your family attends school, please advise the Principal, Head PE Teacher or Year Advisor of the unique Wheelchair Sports NSW Roadshow program that we run. This program covers a 20 minute presentation on topics such as Road Safety "the consequence of taking risks", Disability Sport, Living with a Disability, followed by a game of Wheelchair Basketball that all students get to participate in, using the 12 wheelchairs that we bring to the school.

WS NSW Multi-disability Lawn Bowls State Championships

In fine and sunny conditions Park Beach Bowling Club at Coffs Harbour provided an excellent venue for the 2012 WS NSW Multi Disability State Championships 2012. Thirty two competitors entered in pairs and singles events comprising the set play format of two games over nine ends with a three end tie breaker if necessary. Competitors came from all areas across NSW with Josh Barry from Victoria and a team of South Korean veterans also competing. The South Korean veterans have visited us on several occasions over recent years and are becoming more competitive with each visit.

After a warm welcome from the President of Park Beach Bowling Club, Mr Jim Gorman, competition began with the pairs on Tuesday morning. The final was played on Wednesday afternoon with Michael Vassallo and Josh Barry winning the Gold from Y-B and K-H Kim (South Korea). Carolyn Nelson and Jamie Reynolds won the bronze from Henry Ryan and Gilbert Hicks.

With the pairs out of the way, competitors settled into the singles with some very close games and plenty of tie breakers. Sectional play for the men consisted of five sections with the winners and the next three best performed runners-up making the quarter finals, whilst the ladies conducted their event with one section. By the conclusion of play on Friday afternoon the men's semi-finals had been concluded and the ladies event had been completed with Carolyn Nelson winning gold from Lyn Smith. Joy Boyd took home the bronze beating Cheryl Benbow in a tough match.

On Saturday morning in perfect conditions Jamie Reynolds, Jim Sigsworth, Kim K-H (Mr Bang - South Korea) and Josh Barry began their campaign for gold with Jamie and Josh winning through to face each other in the final leaving Jim and Mr Bang to fight it out for the bronze. In the final, Jamie won the first set but Josh settled down to win the second and played consistently through the tie break ends to win a very high standard game of bowls. Both players changed the length regularly and played the full range of shots. In the other decider Jim Sigsworth came home the better to take the bronze in another high class and close game.

The week wrapped up with the medal presentation evening on Saturday night. All the players were in high praise of the facilities provided at Park Beach Bowling Club and Coffs Harbour in general. A feature was the excellent and well-priced standard of accommodation with plentiful disabled access.

Much appreciation is extended to committeeman, Doug Lambert, who at short notice, stepped in to co-ordinate the event and to Jamie Reynolds for keeping the master board up to date throughout the week. Finally, appreciation to President Jim, Bowls Organiser Graham Smallwood, markers, umpires, helpers, caterers and staff of Park Beach Bowling Club for providing excellent facilities in a welcoming manner, ensuring all competitors and their families a wonderful week.

AWD Junior National Championships 10-11 November 2012

WS NSW took a team of four junior track racers (Liam Luff [T34], Luke Bailey [T54], Julie Charlton [T54] and Mikaela Dingley [T54]) to this year's AWD Junior National Championships which were held at the AIS track in Canberra. This was the first time competing at a national level for Liam and Luke, and the first time Julie had competed in a track chair. It was great to see the team in action on the track and showcasing their talents.

Luke and Liam were locked in a tight battle for the duration of the event with Luke taking home Gold in the 400m and Liam taking home the title in both the 100m and 200m. Mikaela showed her commitment to the sport by competing and taking home gold in all the distances on offer - 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m and 1500m while Julie was kept busy winning silver in the 100m, 200m and 400m as well as juggling her field event commitments. A number of other Wheelchair Sports NSW Junior Members including Jess Cronje, Dean Chesolm, Sarah Walsh and Craig Jarrett were also in action in Canberra and finished with some amazing results. WS NSW had far and away the largest representation of any State.
